

Universities and Colleges of Canada Reference Map









Questions and Answers

1. Will the studies I would like to pursue at a Canadian institution allow me to reach my career goals?

It is advised that you enquire with the competent authorities (e.g., professional organizations, higher-education institutions, government bodies, regulatory agencies governing professions) about the recognition of foreign studies in your country or in the country where you intend to continue your studies or to practise your profession. While no authority can guarantee acceptance of a foreign degree or credentials, it is a good idea to verify the probable value of such a credential before seeking admission to a university, college, or school (in Canada or elsewhere).

2. How do I find the program/institution that interests me?

The *Imagine Education au/in Canada* Web site at www.educationau-incanada.ca, contains information about study programs, study permit requirements, and more.

A number of provinces and territories, as well as membership associations, maintain databases of the programs offered by their institutions. Some provinces also provide a centralized on-line registration system for prospective international students. There is a list of all such resources at www.cicic.ca/679/postsecondary-programs.canada.

The Directory of Universities, Colleges and Schools in the Provinces and Territories of Canada, at www.cicic.ca/395/directory-of-universities-colleges-and-schools.canada, lists Canada's recognized, authorized, registered, and licensed institutions, with links to their Web sites, program listings, and information for international students, when available.

Which are the best universities in Canada? There is no formal ranking of universities and colleges in Canada. In fact, it is widely recognized that, across the country, postsecondary programs are remarkably uniform in quality. For a more in-depth study of recognition and accreditation procedures in Canada, see the publication Quality Assurance Practices for Postsecondary Institutions in Canada at www.cicic.ca/393/quality-assurance-in-canada.canada.

3. How to Apply?

IMPORTANT: The admission application process can take considerable time; you should start **at least one year in advance** to compile the necessary information and documentation.

How to get your credentials assessed: Once you have decided which universities or colleges you wish to apply to for admission, you should write directly to the institution's office of admissions (for undergraduate and college programs) or office of graduate admissions (for graduate programs) and ask for detailed application information and forms. The office of admissions will inform you of the documentation, translation, and study permit requirements. The institution's decision is usually announced four to six months after the application deadline, although this can vary from one institution to another.

Student visas: It is advised that you contact the nearest Canadian visa office (embassy or consulate) in your country for information about entry requirements. You can obtain information about student authorizations on Citizenship and Immigration Canada's Web site, at http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/study/index.asp

Language requirements: Most institutions in Canada require demonstration of proficiency in their language of instruction (either English or French), usually through the achievement of a certain minimum score in a standardized language test. You should confirm the details of the language requirement with the office of admissions of the university or college to which you are applying.

Study permits: It is advised that you contact the nearest Canadian visa office (embassy or consulate) in your country for information about entry requirements. You can obtain information about student authorizations on Citizenship and Immigration Canada's Web site, at www.cic.gc.ca/english/study/index.asp

Cost of education: The *Imagine Education au/in Canada* Web site at www.educationau-incanada.ca, will help you to calculate the cost of studying in Canada. It also contains information about study programs, study permit requirements, and more.





Les études que j'aimerais entreprendre au Canada me permettront-elles d'atteindre mes objectifs de carrière?

2. Comment trouver le programme et l'établissement qui m'intéressent?

3. Comment faire une demande d'admission?

IMPORTANT: Les procédures d'admission peuvent prendre beaucoup de temps; il est donc recommandé de commencer au moins un an à l'avance à rassembler les renseignements et la documentation nécessaires.

Degree options to suit your needs

Choose from a full range of degree options, from three- to four-year bachelor's degrees to master's and doctoral (PhD) degrees. Other options include professional degrees as well as certificates, diplomas and short, career-focused programs.

Many universities offer full-time and part-time enrolment options, as well as cooperative education, distance learning and continuing education. Programs are offered in English and/or in French, while some institutions offer instruction in both official languages of Canada.

Graduate studies in Canada

There are three types of graduate degrees:

A **course-based master's degree** requires successful completion of specific graduate-level courses and is typically one or two years in duration.

A research-based master's degree requires successful completion of both graduate-level courses and a thesis and is typically two years in duration. You usually select your thesis topic in consultation with your graduate supervisor, although many universities require a statement of research interests as part of the application process.

A **doctoral or PhD degree** requires the completion of original research and the defence of a thesis that makes a substantial contribution to the advancement of knowledge in your chosen field of study. PhDs usually require two or three years of full-time residency, although it is common to require more time for directed research and writing to complete the thesis portion.

Rewarding research opportunities

When you pursue research in Canada, you become a valued member of a scientific community with a worldwide reputation for excellence and a long-standing tradition of delivering on discovery. Canada's researchers regularly collaborate with world-class partners engaged in groundbreaking work at all levels of study, including the undergraduate level. Close to 50% of publications from Canada are co-authored with other countries—double the international average.

Canada has less than 0.5% of the world's population, but its researchers publish 4.1% of the world's scientific papers and nearly 5% of the world's most frequently cited papers. University scientists performed over \$12 billion of research and development in 2014, including nearly \$1 billion in research for businesses, helping build their competitive advantage.



A sampling of federal scholarship programs

- The Canada Graduate Scholarships-Master's Program offers 12-month awards, valued \$17,500, to Canadian master's and doctoral students. The program supports up to 2,500 students annually.
- The Vanier Canada Graduate Scholarships Program offers 3-year scholarships, valued at \$50,000 per year, to Canadian and international doctoral students in health, natural sciences, engineering, social sciences and humanities research. Up to 167 scholarships are awarded annually.
- The Banting Postdoctoral Fellowships Program offers 2-year fellowships, valued at \$70,000 per year, to Canadian and international researchers in health, natural sciences, engineering, social sciences and humanities research. 70 fellowships are awarded annually.

Canada's Study and Work Permits for International Students

Determine your eligibility

If you are enrolled in a study program lasting 6 months or more you must apply for a study permit.

To be eligible to study in Canada, you must:

- Have been accepted by a designated learning institution (DLI) in Canada. A list of DLIs is available at
 www.cic.gc.ca/english/study/study-institutions-list.asp;
- Prove that you have enough money to pay for your tuition fees as well as the living and return transportation costs for yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada;
- You must be a law-abiding citizen with no criminal record and not be a risk to the security of Canada. You may have to provide a police certificate;
- Be in good health and willing to complete a medical examination, if necessary.

Apply for a Study Permit

You must apply for a study permit from outside of Canada, either online or in person at the visa office responsible for your country or region. A list of visa application centres (VACs) is available at www.cic.gc.ca/english/information/offices/vac.asp.

A document checklist, as well as all necessary forms are available at www.cic.gc.ca/english/study/index.asp. Note that many visa offices have specific local instructions on their respective websites about which documents you must submit with your application. Original documents in languages other than English or French must be accompanied by a certified translation.





A list of countries whose citizens are required to provide in-person biometrics within 30 days of submitting their application is available at **www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/biometrics.asp**.

Obtain your study permit

Upon arrival in Canada, you must present all required documents to an officer from the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA). Once you meet all the necessary conditions, a study permit will be issued to you. The list of required documents is available at **www.cic.gc.ca/english/study/study-arriving.asp**.

Renew your study permit

You can apply to renew your study permit should you wish to study longer. It is important to apply at least 30 days before your current permit expires. More information on how to renew your study permit is available at **www.cic.gc.ca/english/study/study-extend.asp**.





Work while you study in Canada

To be able to work in Canada, you must be registered and enrolled at a designated learning institution (DLI). You must also get a Social Insurance Number (SIN); more information is available at **www.esdc.gc.ca/en/sin/before_applying.page**.

Work on and off campus

If you are a full-time student with a valid study permit pursuing an academic, professional, or vocational training program that leads to a degree, diploma or certificate, you will be:

- Eligible to work on and off campus without a work permit;
- Eligible to work on and off campus for up to 20 hours per week during a regular academic session and full time during regularly scheduled breaks;
- Welcome to have your spouse or common-law partner also apply for a work permit.

If co-op or internship employment is an essential part, not forming more than 50% of your program of study, you must apply for a work permit after having successfully received your study permit.

Stay and work in Canada after graduation

If you have graduated from a designated learning institution and are interested in working in Canada after graduation, you can apply for a work permit under the Post-Graduation Work Permit Program (PGWPP). A Post-Graduation Work Permit may be issued for the length of the study program, up to a maximum of three years. More information is available at www.cic.gc.ca/english/study/work-postgrad.asp.

Canada: Scholarships & Bursaries

Undergraduate Level

Most Canadian universities and colleges offer scholarships at the time of admission based on academic merit. These are generally awarded automatically. Several Canadian universities offer India specific awards: see compilation on page 3-6;

President's Entrance Scholarship

Entrance scholarships recognise and support excellent students, and are renewed based on continued excellent performance. Most Canadian universities offer entrance scholarships for meritorious students who have a high admission average and secure at least an 'A' standing in specific subjects. The value of scholarships range between \$2,000-10,000. There are also other attractive awards administered by universities or faculties which students can access.

Once students have begun their studies, they may become eligible for scholarships and bursaries offered by universities and individual faculties on the basis of outstanding academic performance.

PhD and Post-Doctoral Awards

The Government of Canada has instituted some very attractive scholarships for scholars at the PhD and postdoctoral levels to attract the world's best and brightest students and researchers to Canada.

- The Banting Post-doctoral Fellowship Program provides for 70 new fellowships per year, valued at \$70,000 annually for two years. www.banting.fellowships-bourses.gc.ca
- The Vanier Canada Graduate Scholarships provides up to \$50,000 per year for three years for world-class PhD students. www.vanier.gc.ca
- IDRC Research Awards available to students pursuing masters or doctoral studies at a recognized university or having completed a master's or doctoral program at a recognized university.
 www.idrc.ca
- IDRC Doctoral Research Awards open to citizens of developing countries pursuing their doctoral studies at a Canadian university. These awards support field research in one or more developing countries. Candidates must conduct their research in areas corresponding to IDRC program priorities and must ensure that their research project aligns with these priorities. www.idrc.ca
- Trudeau Scholarships available to students who have been accepted or will be accepted into a doctoral program at a Canadian university. The Foundation favours applications of students from developing countries. www.trudeaufoundation.ca
- CIFAR Global Scholars Program requires candidates to have completed their PhD within the three years prior to the starting date. Individuals currently completing their doctorates are also eligible to apply. Applicants who are in the process of finishing their PhD must provide a letter from their department chair or faculty dean confirming that all degree requirements will be fully completed before the advertised starting date. Global Scholar positions normally are held in conjunction with a university postdoctoral appointment. www.cifar.ca

Mitacs

Mitacs is a unique innovation-driven internship program that provides Indian undergraduate students with three-month research internships under world class researchers at Canadian institutions or industries. Over 400 students have participated in Mitacs since 2010. Alumni of the Mitacs program are provided with a full scholarship to do their post graduate studies in Canada. Mitacs is a Canadian research network with 88 Universities (54 Canadian), 1000 professors, 1500 students and 650 companies. www.mitacs.ca

Killam Scholarships

The scholarships recognize excellence in graduate and postgraduate studies. The awards are offered at four premier Canadian universities: University of Alberta, University of Calgary, University of British Columbia and Dalhousie University. The value of the awards ranges between \$20,000–44,000. www.killamtrusts.ca

Sauvé Scholars Program

This unique program is designed to equip, enable and empower a new generation of global leaders. Selected students spend an academic year with access to all resources at McGill University with guidance from expert academic advisors and mentors. www.sauvescholars.org

Corporate Awards

Many private companies and government agencies provide awards that can be applied against study at a Canadian institution. These may be governed and administered by the sponsoring company. Contact the university/college for details.

Loan Programs

Some universities may offer in-course financial aid (loans and/or bursaries) to full time undergraduate and graduate degree students in good academic standing on the basis of demonstrated financial need. Consult individual universities' websites for more information.

University of Alberta

University of Alberta-India Centenary Scholarship: valued at \$20,000 and payable over four years.

University of Alberta First Year Excellence Scholarship: valued at \$3,000 and applicable in the student's first year.

University of British Columbia

UBC recognizes achievements of outstanding students from around the world, including many students from India. The university dedicates more than \$7 million annually to awards, scholarships and other forms of financial assistance for international undergraduates.

UBC's International Leader of Tomorrow award is one of the premier university study awards in Canada. Candidacy for this competitive award is by nomination only, and awards are based on outstanding academic and extracurricular achievement and demonstrated financial need. The value is up to a total of \$40,000 CAD per year.

All students are considered for merit-based scholarships, including UBC's Outstanding International Student Award. Over 500 scholarships are awarded up to a maximum value of \$6,000.

Carleton University

Entrance scholarships: \$4,000 to 16,000

Major scholarships, valued at \$3,000, \$5,000 and \$10,000 (renewable annually).

Prestige Scholarships: Students with an average of over 90% are eligible to apply. These competitive scholarships are awarded based on a student's admission average and their participation in community and secondary school activities.

In-course Scholarships: Students who do not enter on a scholarship will automatically be considered for an incourse scholarship for the following year if they achieve at least an A- standing. These awards range from \$750 to \$1,000 depending on the program and average achieved.

Bursaries: Bursaries are available for those who require financial assistance after their first year of undergraduate studies.

University of Manitoba

Entrance scholarship: up to \$2,000

Once you have begun your studies, you may become eligible for one of the limited number of upper year scholarships that are awarded by the individual faculties on the basis of outstanding academic performance.

In addition to these scholarships, the University of Manitoba has established a bursary program designed to assist international students with financial need meet the cost of tuition and living expenses.

McGill University

Entrance scholarships: One-year scholarship valued at \$3,000

Major scholarships, valued at \$3,000, \$5,000 and \$10,000 (renewable annually).

McGill also offers financial aid in the form of loans and bursaries (non-repayable aid) to eligible students who demonstrate financial need. The assistance is meant to supplement other sources of core funding such as government aid, parental support, part-time work and, in some cases, a student line of credit from the bank.

Mount Allison University

The university offers six prestigious Bell Scholarships valued at \$48,000 each (\$12,000 per year) and five Bell Achievement Awards valued at \$36,000 (\$9,000 per year). These scholarships are awarded to outstanding high school graduates who display academic ability, leadership capabilities, and interest in community development initiatives.

Queen's University

Queen's offers five entrance scholarships to Indian students under their "Principal's International Scholarship – India" award. Students with high grades are automatically considered for this award. The award has a total value of \$20,000, with \$10,000 awarded in the first year and renewable for a second year, provided a minimum 3.70 GPA is maintained in a full course load in Year One.

Quest University

The Quest Merit Based Awards recognize student excellence. They include the David W. Strangway Awards for Excellence (full tuition), and the Quest University Canada Scholarship (up to \$24,000/year). Recipients of these scholarships are recognized for a combination of academic excellence, leadership and volunteer service, as well as accomplishments and potential contributions to the Quest community. Quest also boasts of a unique fee structure under which it offers the same tuition fee to all students regardless of their country of origin.

The University of Regina offers the India International Entrance Scholarship, valued at \$1,000, to Indian students wishing to pursue any undergraduate program.

Simon Fraser University (SFU)

The SFU-India Entrance Scholarship: provides \$10,000 (plus \$1,000 travel allowance) to Indian students with an average of 95% (34 IB) or above. Students are automatically considered for this scholarship.

The SFU-Delhi Public School Entrance Scholarship: provides \$10,000 (plus \$1,000 travel allowance) for students of Delhi Public School with an average of 95% or above.

H.Y. Louie and Lohn Foundation Entrance Awards: valued at \$5,000 are offered to high school students who have high financial need and a demonstrated commitment to volunteer activities. A minimum average of 80% is required.

University of Toronto

The University of Toronto has comprehensive scholarship programs to recognize outstanding achievements at different levels of study. The university awards approximately 1900 admission scholarships and over 4000 in-course scholarships every year. No application is required for most of these awards.

The Rotman School of Management offers entrance scholarships ranging from \$10,000 to \$40,000. Rotman also offers the Rotman Interest Subsidy Program (RISP) to assist students with the interest incurred on such a loan while the student is enrolled in the MBA program.

International Entrance scholarship: \$10,000

Merit scholarship (\$1,000) and a President's scholarship (\$2,000) are also offered to incoming students.

In the second year of study, students may become eligible for more scholarships that are awarded by the university and individual faculties on the basis of outstanding academic performance.

Western University (University of Western Ontario)

Western University offers three scholarships worth \$50,000 each to outstanding international students.

The university also offers Admission Scholarships: \$1,000 to \$2,000

Secondary school students with final admission average of 88% or greater and who are registering for full-time studies at the Main Campus, are guaranteed a scholarship worth at least \$1,000. As the average increases, so does the scholarship. If the student earns a final admission average of 90% or better the scholarship increases to \$2,000, only for enrolling at Western's Main Campus.




